"MY CALL" by MERVYN SMITH

I remember very clearly when I first played cricket for the Bellville Cricket Club: it was beginning of 1953 and I can even remember that I scored Io furni! The game was at the old cycle track on Voorttekker Road and the captain of the team was Cecil Aspeling.

I played for the club for at least 30 years and made lifelong friends through cricket, The club was nowhere near as classy as it is today and the first team did yery well indeed just to keep in

the second division. Although we were victorious from time to time in the second division, there was no ejection in those days of promotion or relegation in the first division. That was only to come very much later when cricked administration in the Western Province operate cricked administration in the Western Province operate to the game and the northern arms became a control to be reciclosed with, which is very much the position tools.

Because we were not in the first division very marry of our talented school boys west to clubs that did have first division status and so the quality of our cricket never improved for many years. By the mid-60's I had become captain of the second team—a position that I was so occupy for a long time thereafter.

Emaining that the team was not short of players on Standardy was a major hazard of march ceretaries.  an opening bowler with a howling south-easter

- that they were not going to bowl;
 the horrible feeling of being 10 for 3 just a quarter of an hour after the game started, knowing that you would never recover;

 - a catch, or a clean bowl;
 the sneaky feeling after an LBW in your favour that it was obviously not out but you shut up
 - anyway:
 Saturday nights at the Railway Hotel, Bellville,
 - washing the beer down with hot chips;
 the batsman crossing the outgoing batsman, just having been clean bowled, telling the incoming
 - after a run-out, arriving at the pavillon and saying, "it was my call"

HISTORY OF THE CLUB 1896 - 1996

1896 - 1996

THE BELLVILLE CRICKET CLUB:

THE FARLY YEARS

Bellville has a very rich history and cricket is proud to have been part of it. In 1861 the area was named Bellville, the name originating from Charles Davidson Bell who was the Surveyor-General of the Cape from 1848 to 1872.

According to 1 P. Deminy author of "Trisplight, over the Tygetheg" circlet was the firs sport to be played on an organised basis in Bellville. The first team in the areas was formed in 1896 and called "The Willows". In 1908 it was decided that the club should adopt the name of the fown in which it was situated. From them on it became known as the Bellville Circlet Club.

Willie Morkel (also known as Dooley) was the first captain of Belliville and played an instrumental role in establishing the Cub's first amenities. One of his five sons represented the Springhols that toured the British tales under Nammie Dean in 1929.

The name Duminy is synonomous with the early development of cricker in Bellville.

J.A. Durriny was the first President of the club and the first proceeded first team constituted five Durriny's. In the first photograph taken of club members seven Durrin's were present. A family team, the "Durriny N" also played a few matches over the years. Club matches were played at Hardeksaahjie with some players being fetched by ox-wagon and others arriving on horseback.

J.P. Duminy played for Bellville in the 1913/14 season when they won the Junior Championships. He later played three tests for South Africa towards the end of the 1920's.

During the 1914/1915 season Bell-tille were promoted to the W.P. Senior League but dropped to the Reserve Division in 1917/1918. During the 1919/1920 weapon, the club was again promoted to the Senior Division but for one year only. According to Sect Hermens, a player of the Eime, the club acquired a strip of land east of Hardefazallic of Voortrekker Road, in 1914. This was presumably the ground around which a cycle track was built and was also used by the athletics Calu.

The first turl wicket was laid in approximately 1936 and this remained the headquarters for cricket until 1976.

LES BAXTER (EX-INTERNATIONAL UMPIRE) REMEMBERS

Les Baxter who now lives in Gauteng recently visited Bellville and shared some memories with us.

SECOND DIVISION E TO PREMIER LEAGUE CHAMPIONS

At this stage no-one could remotely have envisaged to what height the club would soar during the next twenty years. During this golden period our first team won the 2E, 2D, 2C, 2B, 2A11, 2A1 first league and the premier division twice and represented W.P. at the National Championships at the beginning of the 1994/95 and 1995/96 seasons. Over these years the captaincy was in relatively few hands viz. Paul Tickner, Mickey Litter, Pat McClachlan, André Scheepers (six seasons including winning the 2A league, Ian Smith (eight seasons and deservedly enjoyed the distinction of leading the club on its debut in the first division and premier league - this included winning both divisional and Barry Toursel who cantained the teams that participated in the National Club Championships. Rory Lavery also led the first team with distinction when Barry, who captained the W.P.

BELLVILLE GLORY:

1988/89

This season with André Scheepers as our Captain and Clive Barham as coach, proved to be a most memorable and enjoyable one. With the new incentive of automatic premotion to the 1st Division being finally implemented we dominated the 2A league to such an actern that we won ill out of 9 matches played outright.

1989/90

A memorable season starting with Lan Smith leading the 1st X1 onto the field for their first official Premier League floture. They had a successful start to their campaign winning three of their 13 matches outright. The 2nd X1 however performed magnificently to win their league gaining promotion to the 2D.

1990/91

The beginning of a new era with the signing of Russell Adams as the professional coach. This season saw the last of the 14 team league with the Premier being split imp 2 sections of 10 teams each.

1991/92

Bellville's Bid for Glory had begun with the First X1, winning the First League and gaining promotion to the New Premier League. 1992/93



alterations to the clubhouse which has made it for more user-friendly to players and spectators alike.




